This historically significant image of the Sydney Harbour Bridge, one of many treasures within the Samuel Marsden Archives at Moore College, will be preserved for future generations thanks to Community Heritage Grants from the National Library of Australia. While Erin Mollenhauer's article details how grants have assisted with the Archives at Moore College, it also raises awareness of the existence of such grants and prompts one to consider which gems within our collections may warrant preservation.

Moore College Library's Community Heritage Grant Journey

The National Library of Australia's Community Heritage Grant (CHG) program provides funding for community organisations which hold nationally significant collections, to enable them to obtain significance assessments, preservation needs assessments, conservation treatment and training workshops (National Library of Australia 2019). The program is a wonderful source of financial support for the promotion and preservation of archival material and the assessment reports provide valuable evidence about the value of collections which can be used to generate further support from stakeholders. The Samuel Marsden Archives, a collecting archive of material relating to the history of evangelicalism in Australia, forms part of the Moore College Library. Over the past decade, the Archives has progressed through all three CHG stages and received a total of around \$35,000 to fund two assessment reports and a variety of conservation treatments for the nationally significant sub-collections described below.

Stage 1: Significance Assessment (2009)

This assessment, written by Emeritus Professor Brian Fletcher OAM, is a comprehensive report describing how various sub-collections in the Samuel Marsden Archives are nationally significant, according to the criteria laid down in *Significance 2.0* (Russell and Winkworth 2009).



These criteria are divided into the primary categories of historic, artistic/aesthetic, scientific/research and social/spiritual significance; and the secondary categories of provenance, rarity or representativeness, condition or completeness, and interpretive capacity. Unsurprisingly, the collections in the Samuel Marsden Archives were determined to contain high levels of historic and social significance, with strong provenance and interpretive capacity. The report does not cover the whole collection of the Samuel Marsden Archives, which has almost tripled in size since it was written but provides an overview of the collection then focuses on eight highly significant sub-collections. The report has been made available on Moore College's repository.

Stage 2: Preservation Needs Assessment (2016)

The next step of the National Library's 3-stage process is to commission a conservator to provide a Preservation Needs Assessment of the same collection assessed in the Significance Assessment. This grant was successfully acquired in 2016 and Tegan Anthes of Preservation Australia completed the report in early 2017. A Preservation Needs Assessment requires close examination of the material composition of the collection items, their current physical and storage conditions, and makes recommendations for any necessary conservation treatment and changes to their environment. Preparation for this highly comprehensive report involved two visits to the archives and leaving a data logger inside the compactus unit for several weeks, to monitor any fluctuations in temperature and humidity. Because of the wide range of formats included in the sub-collections being assessed, the report provides very useful conservation advice which can be applied to other materials of the same type. For example, rehousing paper documents and photographs in individual polyester sleeves.

Stage 3: Conservation Treatment (2018 and 2019)

The third and most exciting stage of the Community Heritage Grant process was applying for funding for conservation work to be undertaken on the sub-collections, according to the recommendations of the Preservation Needs Assessment. In 2018, just under \$15,000 was acquired to have the Samuel Marsden, Bishop Broughton and Henry Waterhouse papers treated and rehoused by a professional conservator, and for archival quality sleeves to be purchased to rehouse the Mary Andrews flannel graph collection. International Conservation Services (ICS) in Chatswood undertook the paper conservation and rehousing.

The following year, further conservation funding of almost \$10,000 was obtained to have the film negatives from the Rev Frank Cash collection identified (as to whether they are cellulose acetate or cellulose nitrate) and rehoused in individual sleeves.

Significant Sub-Collections of the Samuel Marsden Archives

The Sermon Manuscripts of the Rev Samuel Marsden

The Significance Assessment (Fletcher 2010) unfortunately includes incorrect information about the provenance of this collection of 98 sermons – although it states that the sermons came to the College from the Diocesan Library which closed in the 1950s, they were in fact donated in 1961 by the Rev J.R.L. Johnstone (Knox 1961). The correspondence which accompanied this donation has now been clearly identified in the archives catalogue. The report mentions other sermon manuscripts held by the State Library of NSW and the Marsden School in Wellington, NZ, and a testimonial of Rev Dr David Pettett, who used the sermons to write his PhD: “My research would not be possible if it were not for the existence of these 98 sermons in the collection. Despite the fact there is a wealth of material written about Marsden, positive and negative, it is surprising that no one to date has looked carefully at Marsden’s sermons” (Fletcher 2010). The Preservation Needs Assessment identified the fact that each manuscript was stored in an oven bag (!), the ink is iron gall ink, and the paper is handmade with chain lines. The recommended conservation treatment was to rehouse the manuscripts into individual polyester sleeves, then house the sleeves in an acid-free box.

The Bishop W.G. Broughton Collection

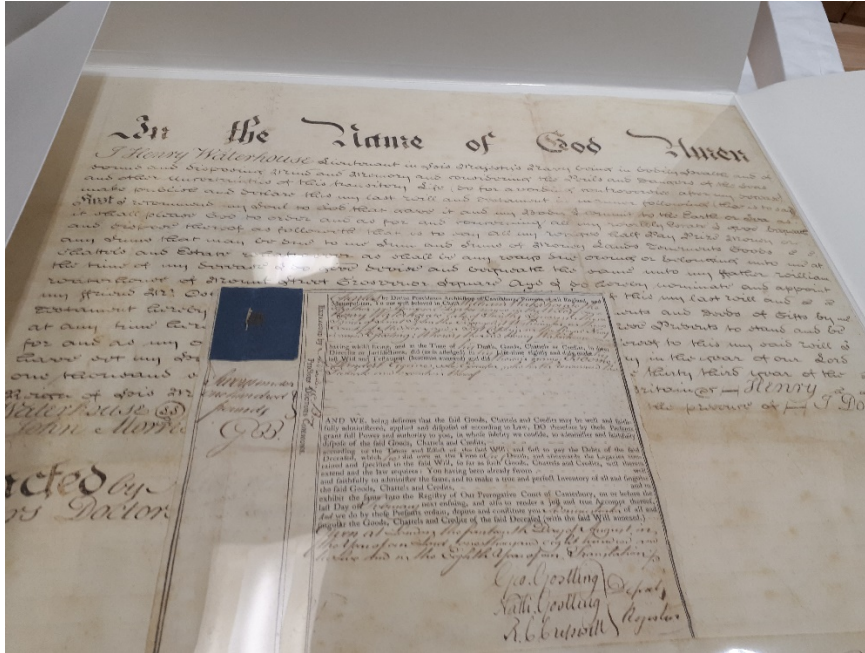
This collection comprises mostly correspondence between Bishop Broughton, his friends Edward Coleridge and Joshua Watson, his wife Sarah and daughter Phoebe. It also includes the journal that Broughton kept during his voyage to Australia on the convict ship *John* in 1829. It was part of the Diocesan Library until the 1950s, when that library closed, and the material was transferred to the College. As the first and only Bishop of Australia, and first Bishop of Sydney (as the diocese was subdivided), Broughton was a highly significant figure in the history of Anglicanism in Australia, and his correspondence reflects both his professional endeavours and aspects of his personal life. As with the Marsden collection, the conservation recommendation was to remove the documents from the oven bags and rehouse them in polyester sleeves inside acid-free boxes.

The Henry Waterhouse Collection

This small collection of 18 letters and legal documents relates to land and other business transactions between Captain Henry Waterhouse, Thomas Moore and other men in the early days of the colony of NSW. It includes documentation relating to the 'Vineyard' property in Parramatta, which was purchased from Captain Waterhouse by Hannibal Macarthur in 1813. Letters from Waterhouse to Thomas Moore mention the Napoleonic Wars, the progress at military college of Moore's stepson Douglas White, and mention Waterhouse's sister Elizabeth who married the explorer George Bass. They have great historical significance in providing details about the social and economic life of the early colony. The paper documents were rehoused in polyester sleeves, while the parchment Will of Henry Waterhouse was flattened using a humidification process, then rehoused in a custom sized acid-free cardboard enclosure.

The Rev Frank Cash Collection

This collection of photographic negatives, lantern slides and associated documentation is most notable for its depiction of the construction of the Sydney Harbour Bridge. Cash was rector of Christ Church Lavender Bay from 1922-1964 and was given permission to access the construction sites of the bridge to take photographs. He also photographed the demolition of houses in Milson's Point, which were knocked down to make way for the approach to the bridge. This historically significant collection contains the preservation challenge of early film negatives, which contain both cellulose acetate and cellulose nitrate film. These negatives are the focus of the most recent conservation grant, which funded their scientific testing to ascertain the exact type of film used, and then to have the negatives rehoused in individual polyester sleeves. The glass plate negatives have been rehoused in acid-free 4-flap enclosures and placed in custom-sized acid-free boxes. So far, the glass negatives and lantern slides have been digitized and are available on the Library's repository.

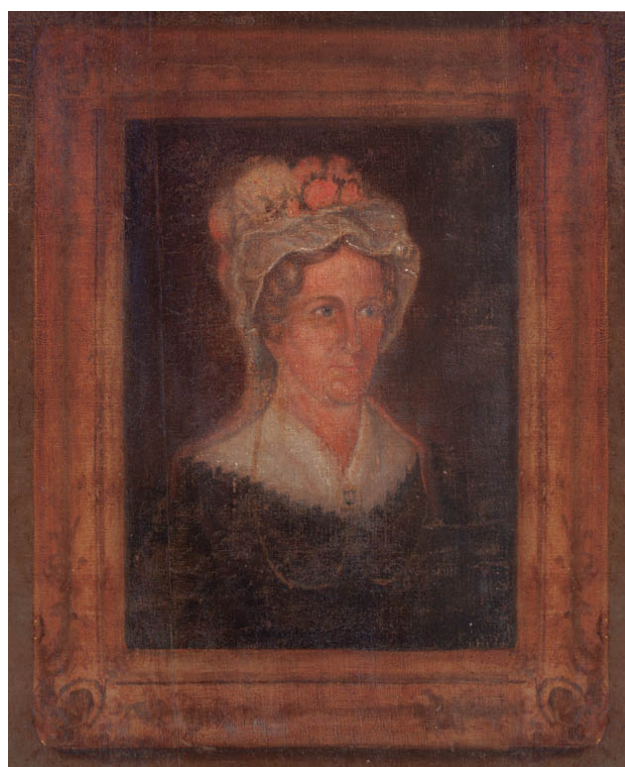
Deaconess Mary Andrews Collection

Mary Andrews was a missionary in China before and during the Second World War, and later served as Head Deaconess and Principal of Deaconess House. She was involved in many women's organisations and was a well-known advocate for the ordination of women to the priesthood. Her large collection contains a variety of papers, diaries, photographs and realia. The paper documents have since been rehoused in acid-free enclosures, although further work remains to be done on the photographs. Part of the 2018 conservation grant was allocated to purchasing polypropylene enclosures for the flannel graphs in this collection. A popular method of teaching Bible stories in the early to mid-20th century, these flannel graphs are hand-coloured and represent almost all the Bible stories commonly taught to children. Their paper envelopes include Chinese annotations, and these have also been preserved in archival sleeves.

'Portrait of the late Thomas Moore, Esq. of Liverpool' by William Griffith

This oil painting, measuring 2.44 x 1.83m, is by far the largest item in the College's collection. It is a portrait of the College's benefactor Thomas Moore and contains within it a picture of his wife Rachel, who had been a Second Fleet convict. It is described in the Significance Assessment as a unique portrayal of a key figure in early colonial history. Due to its significance, the College decided to arrange for it to be fully restored by ICS without waiting for grant funding. This

restoration included cleaning and housing the painting and frame in custom made boxes. A high-resolution photograph of a section of the portrait was printed on a new canvas and framed to hang in the College's main foyer. ICS also provided a digitally reconstructed close-up of the portrait of Rachel Moore, copying the image of the left side of the frame onto the right side, giving the impression of a complete frame.

The Marella Mission Farm Collection

This collection contains all the records from Marella Mission Farm, an independent home for Aboriginal children at Kellyville NSW, operated by Keith Langford-Smith and his wife Gwen from 1949 to 1986. The Library received frequent requests from former residents of the home for copies of their personal records. Because these records not only have great historical significance due to their documentation of out-of-home care for Aboriginal children, they also carry deep personal significance to the care leavers whose childhood memories are contained therein. Rehousing and repair of previous pest damage was recommended by the Preservation Needs Assessment; however, the College made the decision in 2018 to transfer the whole collection to the Australian Institute of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies (AIATSIS) in Canberra.



The E.C.B. Maclaurin Collection

E.C.B. Maclaurin was Professor of Semitic Languages at Sydney University. His collection of research papers on Hebrew and Ugaritic was donated by his widow and includes the Ugaritic dictionary which he compiled. Maclaurin was a leading scholar in this field at the time, and this collection is certainly unlike any other in the Samuel Marsden Archives. The Preservation Needs Assessment recommended rehousing the papers in acid-free folders and boxes, and this work was completed in 2019.

Atla-ANZTLA Scholarship Recipient Report

The Atla-ANZTLA Scholarship is provided by the American Theological Library Association to ANZTLA, for the professional development of theological librarians in the Pacific region. The scholarship is aimed at developing high standards of librarianship and each year applications are submitted from librarians who wish to make use of this opportunity. Professional development may take the form of attendance at the annual ANZTLA conference, or further study in the field of information science. As well as being able to support Cindy Lola from the Pacific Adventist University in PNG to attend the 2019 conference, there were sufficient funds to also support Rebecca Zimmerman from the Catholic Theological Institute in Port Moresby to undertake some online study units. Rebecca used the scholarship to study three online units and has done very well in all of them. The report below was submitted by Rebecca on completion of her study.




With my grant from ANZTLA, (the Atla-ANZTLA Scholarship) I took three online courses through the Association for Library Collections and Technical Services, a division of the American Library Association: *Fundamentals of Cataloging*, *Fundamentals of Collection Development and Management*, and *Fundamentals of Collection Assessment*.

Fundamentals of Collection Development and Management was the first course. I learned about core lists and the RLG conspectus. I started keeping a spreadsheet of books to acquire organized by priority and sortable by recommendation source. I drafted the beginnings of an acquisitions policy. There was a long course reading about faculty consultations for periodical subscriptions, so I designed and administered a survey as I prepared my journals budget for 2020. From the lists of further suggested reading, I obtained materials on how to select books for a core collection, which I will consult as I order books for 2020. This course was useful to me as a selector thinking about how to systematize and prioritize what I was doing.

The next course was *Fundamentals of Cataloging*, which I had hoped was going to be about how to decide which Dewey number to use when doing original cataloguing, but it was almost entirely about MARC, RDA, and FRBR. It was very technical, and outside of my experience, so I found parts of it rather arcane. The class did start with a historical overview of cataloguing principles going back to Cutter, which was illuminating. Contrary to my expectations, there was only one small section on subject cataloguing. I did learn about the importance of a controlled vocabulary. I started working on the subject headings for our catalogue to try to rein it in to a more controlled vocabulary, which past cataloguers did not take care to use. I was able to identify a few small MARC errors that were causing some catalogue entries to display incorrectly. Although I found some of the material inapplicable to my small, simple library in a developing country, I did learn some overarching principles for cataloguing.

Fundamentals of Collection Assessment was probably my favourite from a pedagogical point of view. I enjoyed turning in written assignments each week; I felt like it helped me apply the material and understand it thoroughly. (The other classes just had multiple choice quizzes.) I appreciated the individual feedback on my written assignments from the lecturers as well. I designed an assessment for reviewing selected Dewey numbers for potential weeding, which the assignments throughout the course helped me to refine. The assignment for each week would ask you to use the material covered and write up how it applied to your specific project. I discovered during my stocktake in January 2019 that we had some books catalogued in unused Dewey numbers, like 244. I decided that rather than move all the books to the correct places, I should assess them for weeding first. The books in those numbers were more likely to be out-of-date and removing some books would lessen the amount of re-cataloguing I would have to do. I also



noticed we had some Dewey numbers that had a large number of books catalogued incorrectly in them - 239 had many ecclesiology books -- so I added those Dewey numbers to my list for potential weeding assessment. I completed most of my assessment in the month between the end of classes and the close for the holidays. I moved all the books that were published after 1980, were published by important authors, and/or had 3 or more checkouts; these metrics include both user-centred and collection-centred, subjective and objective measures, as I was taught. This course was a nice confluence between my current job as a librarian and my prior training in social science.

I would like to thank the Australian and New Zealand Theological Library Association Board and Atla for the opportunity to take these classes. I feel that I have grown as a librarian over the course of the year.

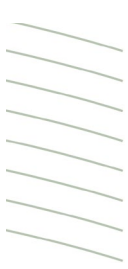


Australian & New Zealand Librarians Attend Atla Annual 2019

Atla Annual 2019 was held in Vancouver, Canada from Wednesday 12th June – Saturday 15th June 2019. Three Australian and one New Zealand ANZTLA members attended as personal members of Atla. Kerrie Stevens (Alphacrucis College, Melbourne Campus), Siong Ng (Carey Baptist College), Cindy Derrenbacker (Whitley College) and Kerrie Burn (Catholic Theological College, University of Divinity) attended various sessions throughout the conference period. The University of Divinity is also an Institutional member of Atla.

The pre-conference excursion to John Richard Allison Library at Regent College and the Chung Collection Archives at the University of British Columbia provided a fascinating insight into the world of rare books and the Chinese experience in British Columbia; whilst also allowing for a brief view on the bus ride into the suburbs of Vancouver outside the city centre where the conference was located.

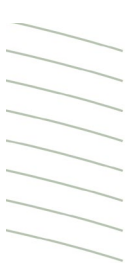
Of the about 205 attendees, 20% of them were internationals, from countries and continents such as Australia, New Zealand, India, Fiji, England, Asia, Africa, Philippines and Europe.

There are several differences between the Atla Annual and the ANZTLA Conferences. One such difference is that there are often four or five concurrent sessions at Atla Annual, so selecting which one to attend can be difficult. The good thing about this is the strict adherence to session time limits - if a session goes on too long, people just get up and walk to the next one, so presenters have to be sure to stay on time. Another difference to ANZTLA Conferences is that, despite most attendees staying at the same hotel, attendees do not gather specifically for meals as a whole (except for the opening and closing reception sessions), and meals are generally not included in the conference fees. This is a strength of the ANZTLA Conferences as it creates a real feeling of collegiality and seems to be where most of the real networking gets done!

The conference began with a newcomers welcoming reception which was hosted by the current President of Atla. What a great initiative as new delegates may find it overwhelming attending a conference of this size for the very first time.

This was followed with the opening reception and an opportunity to visit various vendors' exhibitions. The time was well spent as we were able to meet up with customer representatives from different companies. We had the opportunity to ask questions, to view new titles and had the opportunity to win a prize if we collected signatures from all the vendors. This proved to be a valuable time as we got to connect face-to-face with customer representatives rather than through emails.

The welcome and opening plenary address was presented by Juan Pablo Alperin. Juan reminded us about the importance of open access and how we can offer ways that faculty will consider publishing their research on an open access platform. This address highlighted several tensions faculty experience between making their research freely available or publishing it on a scholarly platform that may affect their promotion or tenure.

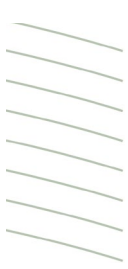


The second plenary session was provided by Sarah Dupont. Sarah delivered her session with passion and presented with obvious affection for her work at the Xwi7xwa library. Her session began with a historical account which was useful for us as our knowledge of indigenous history in Canada was limited. This created a pathway as she then explained the concept of allyship to practice so that support, understanding and respect can be achieved. The work of Xwi7xwa library and the indigitization programme provides insights to the work of indigenisation and decolonization as the aim is to contribute to the process of reconciliation in library settings. The presentation was well executed as delegates left with a sense that librarians are not only information providers but also the mediators of the reconciliation process.

The closing plenary address was provided by Patricia O'Connell Killen who is a Professor of Religious Studies and Senior University Fellow at Gonzaga University in Spokane, Washington. The session was focussed on Pacific Northwest (Oregon, Washington, and British Columbia) religious practice and the influences on other parts of United States and Canada.

The conference was also an opportunity for members of Atla's International Theological Librarianship Education Task Force (ITLETF) (of which Kerrie Burn is a member) to meet face-to-face. The goal of the ITLETF is to strengthen and connect theological and religious studies librarians worldwide by identifying resources, creating educational opportunities, and developing skill-enhancement materials through collaborative efforts. One of the current projects of the Task Force is to publish a series of volumes that comprise *The Theological Librarian's Handbook*, a publication designed for those new to the profession or who may have limited options for acquiring formal training. Kerrie has contributed a chapter on Theological Librarianship in Australia in the volume which outlines the current state of theological libraries around the globe. Another of the activities of the Task Force has been to create a two-week education program for theological librarians from libraries in developing economy countries, and to sponsor several attendees to be part of a formal International Theological Librarian Leadership Institute. Three successful applicants attended the conference as part of the program, one of them being Nalini Premadish from Pacific Theological College, Fiji, who has also attended the ANZTLA conference several times in recent years.

The Atla Annual organising committee and other attendees were all very welcoming of us 'internationals' and many of the ideas discussed at sessions will be looked at further for implementation into our libraries in the near future. The generosity of Atla travel grants and the waived conference fees for attendees from outside the United States and Canada, made it possible for many international delegates to attend.

Overwhelmingly, the Atla Annual 2019 experience was a positive and worthwhile one, and if you get a chance to attend a future Atla event, do it!

The Atla Annual 2020 was scheduled for 17-20 June 2020 in Detroit, Michigan. Due to ongoing uncertainties related to the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, this will no longer be the in-person event that was originally scheduled. Instead, the conference has been reimagined as *Atla Annual 2020 Online*, an online event using the Zoom platform.



ANZTLA 2019 Statistics

ANZTLA Statistician

ANZTLA Statistics are compiled annually from data provided by ANZTLA member libraries on a voluntary basis. All ANZTLA Libraries are encouraged to contribute their data.

The reporting categories are described as follows:

- **A** - Provides clergy training programmes (ie: The Australian and New Zealand Association of Theological Schools [ANZATS] member schools) and/or school and training institutions which offer broad theological training (ie: Bible Colleges, Missionary Training Institutions) possibly leading to degree or post-graduate qualifications;
- **B** - Do not have students (ie: church administrative libraries, resource centres, para-church organisations, etc.); and
- **C** - Institutions offering non-theological courses in addition (ie: teacher training).

Data has been entered as submitted by the libraries. Any questions should be directed to the libraries concerned.

Of the 60 institutional members, 36 responses were received, equating to a 60% response rate. Whilst this seems high, it is the result of a number of institutional members not renewing their memberships based on the cessation of ARI production. Disappointingly, 36 responses is not a high number and is equal to the 36 received in 2019 for 2018 data.

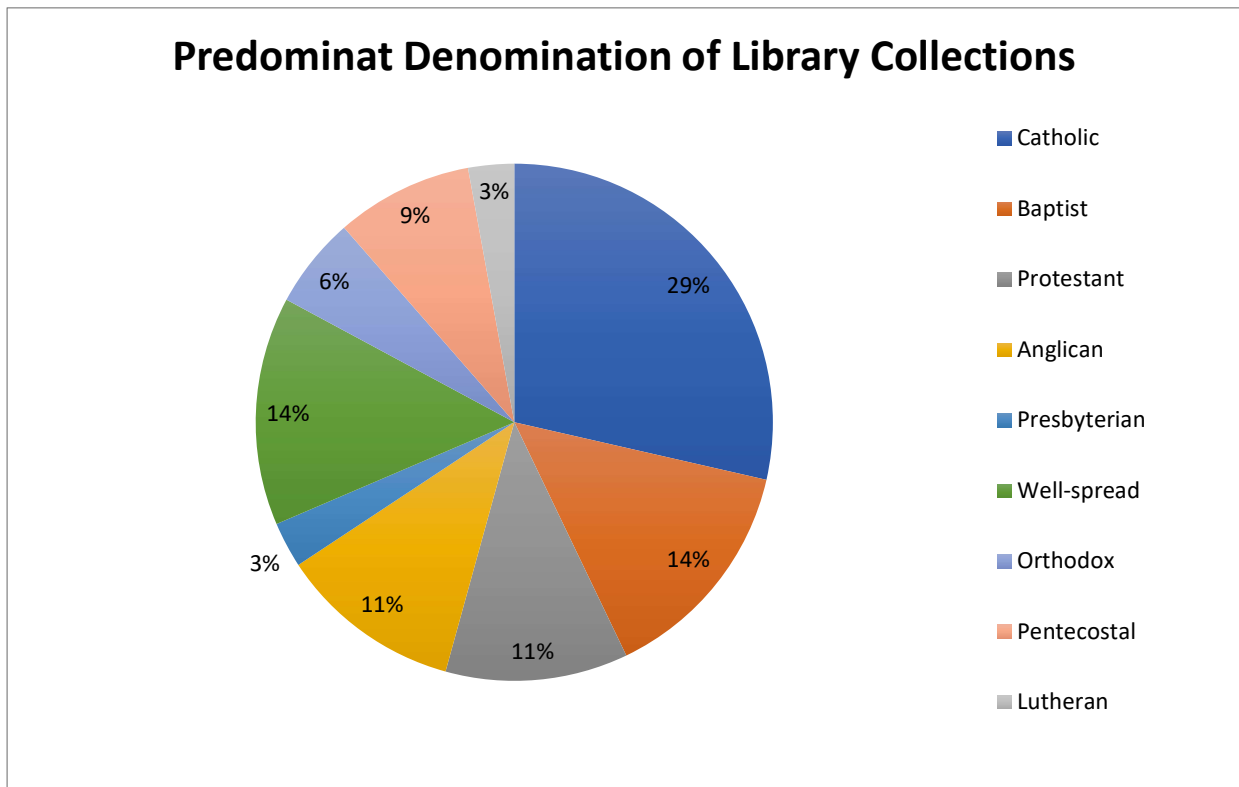
