RDA UPDATE

To date, the entire draft of the main body of the text of *RDA: Resource Description and Access* has been reviewed by all constituent bodies and the Joint Steering Committee (JSC) has read and reacted to all comments.

The next review will be a full review and assessment of the entire text in the online application. The time for critique of the content is past. The review of the online text will take place from October through December 2008.

Particular decisions coming out of the April 2008 meeting include a decision to designate core elements rather than designating all elements as either “required” or “optional.” One of the features of the online product will be the ability to restrict the view to the core elements.

In addition, JSC has agreed to reinstate the statement of responsibility following the title proper and following the edition statement as core elements. Also reinstated is any subsequent edition statement in addition to the primary edition statement. They chose not to reinstate place of publication as a core element.

Regarding corporate bodies, JSC had a choice of including the intent of AACR2 21.1B2 limiting the use of corporate body as creator, or treating corporate bodies as creators in the same way as persons are treated as creators. JSC decided to continue the current practice and reinstated 21.1B2.

The use of “Selections” as a uniform title or as an element of a uniform title has been reintroduced.

The element “gender” is being retained in the chapter on personal names, but the category “other” has been dropped.

NEW SACO FUNNEL PROJECT ESTABLISHED

LC's current policy requires an institution to be an independent member of one of the component programs (CONSER, NACO, BIBCO) of the Program for Cooperative Cataloging (PCC), or be a member of a SACO funnel project in order to submit any proposals for subject headings or classification numbers. To become an independent SACO

member, your institution must commit to the contribution of at least ten to twelve new/changed subject headings and/or LC classification numbers annually.

For most ATLA institutions, the annual contribution requirement is too high. However, ATLA member institutions have an occasional need to suggest new subject headings, additional references to existing headings, new classification numbers, or changes to existing classification numbers. To date, ATLA institutions have not had a way to do this. But that is now changing.

Eric Friede, Assistant Divinity Librarian for Technical Services, Yale University Divinity School Library, has volunteered to become the Coordinator of an ATLA SACO Funnel Project. Thank you, Eric!

If you want to submit a subject or classification proposal, go to the SACO homepage (<http://www.loc.gov/catdir/pcc/saco/saco.html>). On the right side of the screen, at the top, you will find the section: **Subject/Classification Proposal Forms and Guidelines**. By the second arrow under that heading you'll find the link to the E-mail Form, (<http://www.loc.gov/catdir/pcc/saco/sacopropform.html>) for proposing new headings. Fill out this form and email it to Eric at: eric.friede@yale.edu.

Also on the SACO homepage, in the middle left area of the page, in the **Documentation, Tools, FAQ, etc.** area, be sure to read the PDF document: *SACO Participants' Manual*, 2nd edition (<http://www.loc.gov/catdir/pcc/saco/SACOManual2007.pdf>). Please follow the guidelines found there and look at the samples before submitting forms so that they are correctly filled in. Eric will look over the form to make sure all the necessary information is provided and then forward the form to the SACO office.

Discussions of the appropriateness of existing headings and classification numbers, or whether a new heading or classification ought to be proposed, should be conducted on ATLATech. Eric's job is just to make sure the proposals follow the guidelines in the *Manual* and to give LC a single point of contact for communication.

HARVARD MAP COLLECTION ANNOUNCEMENTS

1) The Harvard Map Collection is proud to announce the successful completion of cataloging for our *Imaging the Urban Environment Project*. This project is intended to provide bibliographic as well as digital access to a selection of the Map Collection's antiquarian sheet maps. The bibliographic records total 712 and so far there are 404 links to digital images of each map (with more to follow over the course of the next few months). The digital images are also in the process of being georeferenced so that they can be made available through the Harvard Geospatial Library (HGL) (see: <http://hgl.harvard.edu>)

Many of the maps made available in the *Imaging the Urban Environment Project* will be of special interest to the historian of religions, especially those interested in representations and

personifications of religious and theological concepts. Of great note are the selections of maps of Jerusalem and Rome.

We have used a series title in our local catalog for a shortcut to this collection: Harvard Map Collection digital maps. Imaging the Urban Environment. (for our catalog's search results, see: http://lms01.harvard.edu/F/?func=find-acc&acc_sequence=032018741).

2) The Harvard Map Collection is contributing to the Harvard University Open Collections Program (OCP) collection of materials related to *Exploration and discovery*. Our holdings in U.S. Hydrographic charts as well as other notable antiquarian cartographic materials will be cataloged, georeferenced, digitized and made available through the OCP website, which will contain materials related to exploration and discovery from other Harvard repositories. OCP has already launched three web pages covering fascinating topics using materials selected from across the Harvard Libraries (for more information, see: <http://ocp.hul.harvard.edu/>).

3) All digital and georeferenced cartographic materials of the Harvard Map Collection in HOLLIS and HGL can be searched in one place, making retrieval and access more streamlined and simple. As one of Harvard's virtual collections, *Harvard Map Collection Digital Maps* (<http://nrs.harvard.edu/urn-3:hul.eresource:harvmapc>) is available to all users, so ATLA users and librarians can freely access these resources.

The Report on the Moving Image Genre/Form Project (<http://www.loc.gov/catdir/cpso/movimgenre.pdf>), dated March 17, 2008, is now available in PDF (14 pages). It was prepared by the Cataloging and Policy Support Office (CPSO) for Beacher Wiggins, Director of the Acquisitions & Bibliographic Access Directorate of the Library of Congress, and posted on the LC Web site on July 14, 2008.
