### REPORT OF THE ATLA REPRESENTATIVE TO THE CC:DA

### Midwinter Meeting

I attended the ALA Midwinter Meetings earlier in January, and found that the general attitude to RDA was much more negative than previously. The ALA representative to the JSC acknowledged that the other partners (Great Britain, Canada and Australia) are much more enthusiastic about RDA than is ALA. The tenor was so negative that the chair of CC:DA's parent committee asked whether ALA should seriously consider stepping back from RDA and returning to a revision of AACR2 which would be much less radical. There seems to be little likelihood of that happening, however, since the general feeling was that the "train has left the station and if we get off now, we may never be able to get back on." So the work goes on, however reluctantly.

### Future of Bibliographic Control Report

Based on the recommendation to suspend work on *RDA* included in the *Report to the Library* of Congress on the Future of Bibliographic Control, Deana Marcum indicated in a talk to catalogers at the LC exhibit booth that whether to continue participating in the development of *RDA* would be the first decision taken during the next few months. Decisions and action plans relating to the other recommendations would follow. She reported that she had asked three groups to study the report and deliver their comments to her: LC managers in the Cataloging and Acquisitions division, members of the Reference Division, and Thomas Mann.

RDA content:

There have been very few changes in the content of the rules for access from those rules as presented in *AACR2*. For the most part, the rules have just been rewritten in a very dense,

convoluted manner which makes them hard to understand, using unfamiliar terminology. The terminology used and the style of the writing are two of the major causes of discontent with RDA. To address that concern, JSC is considering hiring a writer to simplify the writing style, once the content of the rules has been finalized.

### ALA Publishing Report

The report of the ALA publishing representative received mixed reviews. The list of features to be included in the online version of *RDA* received unanimous approval. If the initial release of the product contains the features he mentioned, the consensus was that it would be a fantastic product.

He stirred up a controversy when he mentioned that there would be links between *AACR2* and *RDA*. Some committee members thought it was a good idea, and others felt it would be a crutch catalogers should not have. The consensus was that if ALA Publishing did not create the crosswalk, some one else would, so ALA Publishing might as well go ahead and do it.

Finally, he raised a storm of protest when he waffled on whether there would be a print version published. Clearly, the same version prepared for the online product could not just be printed out to provide a print version. Extensive editing would be required. He indicated that if a print product was published, it would not be issued at the same time as the online version. He was informed most emphatically that a print product was essential and that RDA would surely fail without it.
