ÉCOLE BIBLIQUE PLANS MIGRATION TO KOHA

This announcement is made on behalf of the Bibliothèque, Cartothèque, and Photothèque for the École Biblique et Archéologique Française de Jérusalem (<http://www.ebaf.edu>)—where I recently volunteered for three and a half months as a monograph and cartographic materials cataloger:

The cataloging system used by the École Biblique is LiberMEDIA, a French software system that follows UNIMARC standards for cataloging. One flaw of the system is that it is not Web compatible and can therefore not be accessed beyond the library walls. This world class and world famous collection, however, will soon be accessible through the school's Web site, because this fall (2007) the library will be migrating to an open source cataloging system that can be available to researchers all over the world. Fr. Krzysztof Modras, the library's systems manager and the head librarian, Fr. Pawel Trzopek, have chosen the library operating system, Koha (for more about Koha go to: <http://www.koha.org/about-koha/>).

The advantage of the Koha system for the library will be the ability to borrow records from the Bibliothèque Nationale de France. Another advantage of the system migration is that the different departments housed in the library, the bibliothèque, cartothèque, and photothèque will be enabled to catalog into one system. Thus, once online, users can search not only the library's unique and rare monograph and serial holdings (serials are fully indexed), but will be

able to access related materials in different formats, such as photographs, lantern slides, maps, realia and ephemera.

The head of the Photothèque, Fr. Jean-Michel de Tarragon, has already scanned 13,600 photos in high definition (tiff 6.2 mega) and these images will be linked to their descriptive record in Koha. Illustrating the historical richness of the École Biblique et Archéologique Française's collections, these photographs document not only archaeological digs and discoveries but also the social and economic growth and development of Jerusalem over the last 150 years. They also represent the work and presence of the Dominicans in the Middle East—as scholars, as ethnographers, and as a spiritual resource to their neighbors, often the politically and socially estranged Christian Arabs and other marginalized peoples of the region.

Catalogers, bibliographers, and reference librarians alike will gain much from the online catalog for École Biblique et Archéologique Française de Jérusalem, the resources of which are unsurpassed by any other library in the world in the areas of biblical and archaeological studies.

UPDATES ON ATLA FUNNEL PROJECTS (NACO, SACO, SERIES)

At the Technical Services Section (TSS) meeting in Philadelphia on June 14, I presented the following information regarding the question of adding a series funnel and a subject headings funnel to the ATLA NACO funnel. I am including here the main points of that presentation, to which I have appended the results of a meeting with Carolyn Sturtevant, a member of the LC Cooperative Cataloging Team.

The current situation regarding series:

LC. These are the decisions LC has instituted for series handling:

1. Original cataloging: LC will add series statements (490 0#); but will not add series access points
2. Copy cataloging: LC will pass through the series as is, correcting only the series statement if necessary
3. LC has modified the "lccopycat" code to indicate that series have not been validated
4. LC catalogers will not consult, create or modify series authority records. Cooperative team and CPSO will update series only to resolve duplicate records. Coop and CPSO will answer questions from PCC participants
5. LC will continue to coordinate and conduct series training sessions (at least until PCC/ALCTS is prepared to take over the training)

PCC. PCC policy on series remains unmodified: "Member libraries that believe value is derived from series authority control are encouraged to continue this work in accordance with established guidelines and procedures."

RLG. Shortly after LC announced its decision on series, RLG issued a statement supporting LC and indicating that RLG libraries would follow LC.

OCLC. The OCLC CIP Completion Unit and the OCLC Quality Control Unit are fully independent in series and have announced the following:

1. Regarding CIP, series will continue to be verified in the authority file and LC records will be modified accordingly. Staff will create and maintain series authority records as needed.
2. Regarding the Quality Control Unit: Series will be modified in master records in response to member requests. Staff will create and maintain series authority records as needed.

ATLA. From comments on ATLATech and the fact that at the 2006 Annual Conference, twenty-two institutions signed a paper indicating their desire to participate in a series funnel, it is clear that many ATLA institutions continue to see value in tracing series entries and wish to maintain series authority control.

The question for ATLA revolves around how to provide series authority capability to ATLA members. ATLA headquarters staff has concerns about where series funnel activities fall in the priority list of services ATLA staff can provide to members. There is also a concern about centering all funnel activities in headquarters staff and how to provide for continuity as time goes on.

Currently, there are fifteen active participants in the ATLA NACO Funnel, of which two are independent in all areas and one is independent only in personal names.

Suggestions such as hiring a part-time paid coordinator from a member library and/or working with existing funnels outside ATLA have been made.

News from a meeting with LC's Carolyn Sturtevant during the ALA Annual Conference, June 25. It is not necessary for ATLA to set up a formal series funnel. Any member of the NACO funnel who achieves independence in corporate names may attend a series training course. After that course, the person would be assigned a reviewer from a list of qualified series reviewers and could proceed to work toward independence.

*The current situation regarding **subjects**:*

SACO program. Any NACO funnel member institution can become a SACO member by filling out a SACO membership application and appointing a SACO liaison. The

annual goal is ten to twelve submissions (new/changed subject headings and/or new/changed classification numbers)

News from a meeting with LC's Carolyn Sturtevant during the ALA Annual Conference, June 25. Once a member of the NACO funnel fills out a SACO membership application and becomes a SACO liaison, other ATLA member institutions can submit their SACO contributions to that member, who will forward them to LC for consideration. There is no specific training needed, but there is a SACO tutorial in development, which will provide guidance on filling out the SACO contribution form and accompanying documentation. If anyone is willing to become the liaison, let me know and I will facilitate it.

Next steps for ATLA:

The following ideas were suggested as next steps for ATLA staff and members to pursue:

1. TSS will encourage ATLA members trained in NACO to contribute to the ATLA funnel.
2. TSS working with Member Services staff will encourage more members to get NACO training.
3. Judy will work with NACO funnel members to achieve independence, become co-coordinators, and receive training for series contributions.
4. TSS will work with Member Services staff to appoint a Task Force to explore the impact of the changes on ATLA members, gather data, set priorities and make recommendations for action.
