CONSER ACCESS LEVEL RECORD FINALIZED

CONSER has developed a new record standard, called Access Level, which is being promoted as the "floor" record for CONSER. This standard aims to define the mandatory elements which must be present for a particular record to be CONSER-authenticated. See the Access Level Record for Serials, Working Group Final Report at: <http://www.loc.gov/acq/conser/alrFinalReport.html>

The Working Group has recommended that this Access Level Record become the new "full-level" record for CONSER. There is a vocal group challenging that idea, suggesting that a new encoding level should be developed, with "full-level" remaining defined as at present. They suggest that if the Access Level Record becomes the new full-level, then this record will become a "ceiling," rather than a floor, limiting what catalogers feel they can add to a record, especially if the CONSER documentation is revised to include only those fields and elements in the Access Level Record. As new catalogers enter the field, they won't know that anything more is possible.

JSC TO MEET OCTOBER 16-20, 2006 IN WASHINGTON, D.C.

The Joint Steering Committee (JSC) will be continuing its discussion of responses to chapters 1-5 of RDA, along with considering newly prepared responses relating to chapters 6-7 and a proposal from the Library of Congress to change Bible Uniform Titles.

The ALA response to chapters 6-7 includes a section called RDA Development Issues, which describes a "growing crisis of confidence within ALA regarding the RDA development process and its ability to produce a viable standard." The section includes, among other things, a call for a revised timeline which will allow time for consideration of general principles and for a review of the completed code in its entirety. There is not the same frustration and concern among the international partners in the process, so it is not clear what the outcome of this discussion will be.

In addition to discussions of the already released part A, the preliminary draft of part B, Access Point Control, will be considered. After completing revisions arising from the discussion at the meeting, the complete draft of RDA part B will be available for review in December 2006.

A PLEA FOR AUTHORITY CONTROL, OR, WHY YOU SHOULD JOIN THE ATLA NACO FUNNEL PROJECT

As theological librarians we all already *know* the importance of authority control for the successful use of our library catalogs by our internal and external constituencies. However, you may be like me in that you haven't really thought about authority control recently in a systematic manner. If so, you may also be wondering if participating in the upcoming ATLA NACO funnel project could really be all that useful to you and your library. Fundamentally, is the time and money needed to participate in the project a good investment? I would argue that it is most certainly a worthwhile investment both personally and institutionally.

Arlene G. Taylor defines authority control as "the results of the process of doing authority work, which means that headings in surrogate records are consistent with the character strings for those headings established in the authority file."¹ In the North American library cataloging world this translates to "headings in MARC bibliographic records are made consistent with those headings in MARC authority records." The reasons for creating this consistency in heading form include the need for collocation and the need for differentiation. We collocate records, and by extension their associated materials, in order to

bring together all manifestations of all names used by a person or corporate body, and to bring together all differing titles of the same work. We differentiate records in order to distinguish persons or corporate bodies with the same name from each other.

As catalogers, we regularly collocate and differentiate materials in our everyday work of cataloging when creating bibliographic records. When we make a decision about the correct AACR2 form of entry for an access point, we are already doing authority work. In fact, we are doing both the technical work of choice of form and the research involved in determining if the particular access point is the same as (collocation) or different from (differentiation) another access point in our catalog. In my experience, the work of establishing the correct form for a heading in a bibliographic record is where I spend most of my time when doing authority work. The additional time to create an authority record for the form I am already using is relatively minor compared to that original effort. In short, you are already doing most of the work needed to participate in a NACO funnel project, so why not do an incrementally small amount of additional work and reap the benefits?

The institutional benefits of participating in a NACO funnel project are myriad. If you create name authority records based on your research then you guarantee that the forms of headings used in your original cataloging match the forms in the national authority file. This has the not insubstantial advantage of reducing the local database maintenance that is necessary when new name authority records are created that don't match the choice of form used in your bibliographic records. In addition, name authority records created by experts in a subject area, and have no doubt that as theological librarians that you are experts in theological cataloging, are often more correct than name authority records created by catalogers working outside their area of expertise. Consider that the resources available to you for research and the depth of your collection in other materials by the same personal or corporate author are likely to be greater than almost any general academic library. If you rely on someone else to create a name authority record, you may find out that they didn't have as much information and expertise available as you and that as a result they chose a different form of entry than what you would have chosen.

There are also personal benefits to participating in a NACO funnel project. Specifically, you will learn more about how to create access points for personal and corporate names than you probably already know. Personally, I always find that in cataloging training, there is always some aspect of the AACR2 or the LCRI that I had forgotten or never knew. If you are looking for continuing education to stretch your cataloging skills, you can't do much better than going to the NACO training. Another benefit of participating is the personal satisfaction you will get from contributing to a shared national, and becoming international, collaborative project.

Now that I've (hopefully) convinced you of the importance of authority work and the value of participating in a NACO funnel project, consider the added value of the *ATLA* NACO funnel project. The *ATLA* NACO funnel project is one of only nine subject- or language-based funnel projects and is unique in being the only funnel project managed by a professional library organization.ⁱⁱ The project is also unique in its focus on NACO work for theological and related literatures. Some of the well-known distinctives of theological literature are the challenges of establishing uniform titles for sacred works, the sometimes complicated genealogical histories of religious denominations and the associated corporate

name headings for the same, and the difficulties in attributing responsibility and the creation of access points for some of the more ephemeral literature we all collect to some extent. Because of the distinctive nature of the problems associated with cataloging theological literature, the ATLA NACO funnel project will likely be a better fit for ATLA libraries than any other geographically-based NACO project. Not only will the ATLA NACO training use examples specific to our work as theological librarians, but Judy Knop, our funnel coordinator, has a wealth of experience to share relating to NACO work for theological materials. Judy, as those of you who have benefited in the past from being trained by her will agree, is an excellent technical trainer, and I can't imagine anyone better able to teach and shepherd theological librarians through the NACO training and subsequent review.

In conclusion, authority control is one of the core components of library cataloging and is crucial to the successful use of library catalogs. In order to do our authority work better and more efficiently, theological librarians should seriously consider participating in a NACO funnel project. As ATLA members, the natural choice would be to join the ATLA NACO funnel project. That project is one of the most important member services that ATLA offers to its institutional and personal members, and I strongly encourage you to consider participating in the upcoming training for the project.
