ALA 2005: SUMMARY OF TECHNICAL SERVICES EVENTS

This year the main focus of my time at the conference was on Connexion, Authorities, and future trends.

The first meeting I attended was Technical Services Directors of Large Research Libraries, commonly referred to as Big Heads. There were a couple of useful items I picked up here. Several of the universities have divided up the languages and are focusing on their European backlogs. Harvard has taken German. There was a report about canceling print subscriptions to journals. Most are cancelled as they move toward online access, but they are maintaining one print copy somewhere in their consortium. They studied the financial impact and found that it is taking three to five years for any benefits to show up, but the benefits include the cost of the print copies, savings in binding costs, and savings in staff time from check-in and bindery processing. Most of the reporting institutions have moved the staff who no longer have check-in duties to scanning duties.

The OCLC Symposium featured Chris Anderson, who spoke at length about his concept of the long tail, which he wrote about in *Wired* in 2004, with responses from three other people. The point I picked up from this is that if we only have the most popular books and journals, we won't be meeting the needs of 25–40 percent of our users. Items need to be described in depth, because most users are not able to browse the shelves to find what they need.

Saturday morning's first meeting echoed this last thought, as the focus was on providing access to items in storage. Cataloging should be as detailed as possible, items that are bound together should each be described and the records linked for circulation purposes, and the display of the storage information in the OPAC should be clear to the user.

The Catalog Management Discussion Group had a presentation on OCLC's quality control activities. Last year they adjusted name and subject headings in 9.3 million records. Duplicate detection has been run fifteen times over the years, but the program must be rewritten before it will work in Connexion. They now have software that finds subject terms in the wrong subfield so corrections can be made. With a future upgrade of Connexion, we will be able to choose the level of validation preferred.

The Cataloging Norms Discussion Group had a presentation on vendor-supplied authority control. They discussed what to expect from the process and what still needs to be done locally. The procedures I developed this year meet the recommendations. I heard that in some systems you can protect certain fields in the authority records.

At the OCLC breakfast, I sat at the catalogers' table and learned that next year all libraries will have to have subscription pricing for their cataloging activities. The price they set will be based on activities from calendar year 2005, so I suggest being conservative in the amount of searching done the rest of this year, as it will affect the future budget.

The Connexion Users Group included some current features and future enhancements. They seemed to be excited about the statistics, which are now free with Connexion, instead of for a fee as with the previous interfaces. You can see them at www.stats.oclc.org/cusp/nav. There was also a presentation about controlling headings. They recommended doing a Control All, then going ahead and replacing the master record, before doing any other editing. The cataloger must be logged on with a full-level authorization to do this.

The Authority Control in the Online Environment Interest Group included discussion of using MARC authority records in an XML environment. Some of this was over my head technically, but it was nice to see what some libraries are doing to create and share additional authority records.

The Copy Cataloging Discussion Group had a presentation on CIP updating at the Library of Congress. They discussed the level of staff, the procedures followed, and the relationship with publishers. LC is encouraging most publishers to join the program that submits complete galleys electronically to the CIP process. This is better for subject analysis and avoids many of the mistakes that were frequent in the past.
