### BOOK REVIEW

Miller, Dick R. and Kevin S. Clarke. *Putting XML to Work in the Library: Tools for Improving Access and Management*. Chicago: American Library Association, 2004. 205 p. ISBN 0-8389-0863-2 (softcover). Price: \$45.00.

In our ever-changing world it is imperative that theological librarians entrusted with the responsibility of managing and providing access to information keep abreast of those technological developments that harbour the potential for the further enhancing of information retrieval. More specifically, cataloguers, while committed to such time-proven standards as MARC and Z39.50, must be willing to adopt and embrace new methods of data description as cataloguing practices evolve.

In their new book *Putting XML to Work in the Library: Tools for Improving Access and Management*, Dick R. Miller and Kevin S. Clarke investigate the opportunities made available to libraries presented by the Web technology of XML (short for eXtensible Markup Language). The authors note that, in addition to the technical underpinnings for Web enhancements, XML technology provides the possibility for creating future information systems that can interact in a broader, more global context than is currently possible, eliminating artificial barriers to access and further minimization of redundant work. They do caution that the development of any new information management standards requires "the thoughtful reassessment of traditional practices."



Miller and Clarke have divided their text into two basic sections. The first two chapters provide the reader with foundational information regarding the basics of producing XML, explanations of key concepts and standards (including W3C, RELAX NG, Xpath, and style sheets), and historical data regarding the development of the technology.

What may be of particular interest to cataloguers, however, is the second section of *Putting XML to Work in the Library*. Within the last three chapters of the text we are treated to an engaging discussion regarding the application of XML to the library workflow. After placing MARC and AACR in their historical context, the authors focus extensively on the implications of these standards for XML schema development. Characteristics in MARC such as economy of expression, date inconsistencies, intra- and inter-format redundancy, its varying ways for distinguishing metadata, extreme coding complexity, and non-hierarchical structure have become obstacles to newer technologies such as XML. Our current electronic environment also calls for a reevaluation of AACR rules and methods of authority work. Using Lane Medical Library as a case study, Miller and Clarke demonstrate how programs such as XMLMARC (converts MARC into XML) and MARCUTL can enhance MARC records and treat such problematic items as transitional E-journals.

In concluding, it is important to note that the well-written text is comprehensible even for the reader with limited technical knowledge. Features such as the graphical displays of various XML examples and the detailed table of contents, bibliography, and index bring added value to the authoritative ALA publication. Most significantly, *Putting XML to Work in the Library: Tools for Improving Access and Management* is an important read for library managers and cataloguers in theological libraries who seek to provide seamless access to their increasingly diverse forms of theological data and who wish to anticipate the future information needs of their patrons.

## 2005 ATLA CONFERENCE NEWS FOR TECHNICAL SERVICES FOLKS

You will all soon receive the pre-conference program for this year's meeting in Austin, Texas, June 14–18, 2005. I wanted to give you a glimpse at the sessions planned that may be of interest to Technical Services people.

On Tuesday, Joanna Hause and Jeff Brigham will facilitate the pre-conference Technical Services session on “Migrating to OCLC Connexion.” On Wednesday, Judy Knop will be presenting a workshop on the booklet *Differences Between, Changes Within*, clarifying some of the new rules about when to create a new record for an item. On Thursday, Richard Lammert will lead the Technical Services Section in a discussion about “ISBN—Past, Present, and Future,” and on Saturday, he will present a paper on “Using Unicode in the Local ILS.”

The Education Committee has planned a series of roundtables, including several on issues related to serials. On Thursday, I will lead a discussion on “Planning the Future of Your Serials

Collection,” looking at use surveys, collection review, and the impact of electronic serials. On Friday, Terese Jerose will discuss “Knowing What You Have,” reviewing the options for cataloging or listing electronic journals; Joanna Hause will discuss “Connecting to Connexion;” and Andy Keck will cover “From Cites to Sites,” looking at the basics of OpenURLs. On Saturday, folks may also be interested in the roundtable on “Care and Control of CDs and DVDs” or a discussion on “Retention and Binding Policies.”

On a more general note, the conference planners have taken the opportunity while in Austin to plan a tour of the special collections at the Harry Ransom Center at the University of Texas, a roundtable discussion of resources for Hispanic ministries, and a panel discussion of the Virgin of Guadalupe.

I hope everyone will make plans to attend as many interesting sessions as possible, and I will see you in Austin.
