REVISING THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CLASSIFICATION FOR THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Theological libraries using the Library of Congress (hereafter LC) schedules for the classification of their holdings have long struggled with some of the difficulties posed by the LC classification scheme. The assessment by Ruth C. Eisenhart in 1960 that "the religion schedule (BL-BX) is not one of [LC's] best"¹ is still appropriate. Although several people have prepared modifications for various denominations, most libraries nevertheless use the schedules as developed by LC.

The deficiencies in some of the religion areas can be noted even when collecting only standard theological works in Western languages. What happens when one attempts to start documenting world Christianity, expanding considerably the amount and languages of material collected? Should one continue to use LC unmodified, or introduce some modifications?

This was the question that we at Walther Library, Concordia Theological Seminary, started asking about six years ago. Using the LC schedules unmodified would mean ease of use, and the ability to accept any classification number assigned by LC in the future, yet having to "shoehorn" in some acquisitions. Modifying the schedules would make the classification work well for us, but would mean constant awareness of new material being received with LC classification numbers already assigned, with the need to change those to our own system. The immediate impetus for questioning our classification scheme was the publishing activity of a new non-profit organization, Lutheran Heritage Foundation, based in Sterling Heights (now Macomb), Michigan, whose goal was to make "confessional Lutheran materials available in the languages of the people around the world." Because we wanted to receive a copy of everything they published—an arrangement that we have successfully established it was clear that we would be receiving many items that LC would never see, and for which they had never provided a place in their classification schedules.

Because modifying the entire Lutheran section of the LC schedule and applying it to our collection was far too daunting a task,² we chose a much narrower focus: revising the section of the LC schedules in which the Lutheran confessions are classified. The Lutheran confessions are contained in the *Book of Concord*, published in 1580. Except for the three ecumenical creeds (classified in BT990+), the parts of the *Book of Concord* are classified among the Lutheran denominational material by LC. A synopsis of the LC classification of the *Book of Concord* follows:

Even for someone who does not know the *Book of Concord*, the heavy—and almost exclusive—emphasis on the languages of German, English, Norwegian, and Swedish is apparent. The relegation of Luther's Catechisms in "other languages" to one cutter number, not even divided A through Z, seemed to pose a very large problem for a library trying to document world Lutheranism.

For someone who *does* know the *Book of Concord*, the schedule offers additional strange aspects, since Luther's Large and Small Catechisms, as well as his Schmalkald Articles, are a part of the *Book of Concord*, yet are listed as "other special catechisms and creeds." Equally as strange is the inclusion of the Saxon Formula of 1551 in the *Book of Concord*, when in fact, it is *not* included therein.

To be fair to the Library of Congress, the schedule works well for them for two reasons. First, the schedule is based on literary warrant, so what the Library of Congress doesn't collect isn't reflected in the schedule. Second, LC itself can classify in other areas what we would consider as a vital part of documenting world Lutheranism. One example is a facsimile edition of *Martin Luther's Little Catechism, Translated into Algonquian Indian by Johannes Campanius.* The book, an edition of Luther's Small Catechism, is classified by LC in PM1034, as a text in the Delaware language. Such a classification is appropriate for a library emphasizing the social sciences, but not for a Lutheran seminary library.

Because of the disadvantages of this section of the LC schedules for us, we decided to revise the section. In so doing, we had several goals: (1) provide a place in the schedule for the *Book of Concord*, as well as each of its parts in the order of these parts in the *Book of Concord*; (2) provide a consistent manner of handling translations; (3) provide a place for works *about* each of the parts; and (4) avoid conflict with existing LC classification numbers. To achieve these goals, we explicitly disregarded literary warrant, providing places for anything that *might* be published. Other than this exception, the new schedule is very "LC-like:" the whole before the parts, the original language before translations, and texts before works about the texts.

Our new schedule follows. The existing LC classification numbers are included to show how this new schedule dovetails with the existing schedule:

The first step in adopting this schedule was, of course, to reclassify everything we already had classified with the existing LC schedule. Since then, however, we have used this modification successfully. By using only unused LC numbers, we have made it easy to find books that slip into our collection with standard LC numbers: a scan of the shelf list for the LC classification numbers not used will show any books that have not been reclassified.

In assessing the result of this change, I am very satisfied. It is possible to walk to the shelf and find an edition of the *Book of Concord* or any of its parts in any language almost without effort. The shelf arrangement resulting from this revised schedule is quite appealing in a library with open stacks.

Is this revision perfect? No. The need to "squeeze in" our numbers between those already used by LC produces some jumps in the numbering, as well as one anomaly, only one cutter for *The Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope*. (Here literary warrant is on our side. We did this purposely, not expecting much separate publication of this part. In fact, exactly how we will use this number remains to be seen, since we so far have nothing classified here.)³ In addition, the arrangement by language (following the MARC code list of languages) does not always collocate languages the way one might desire. Although we have Luther's Small Catechism in only one Hmong dialect, White Hmong, this is cuttered for the form of the language used in the MARC code lists, "White Hmong." This will eventually separate it from

Hmong Njua (assuming we get a catechism in that language). But a complete revision of the MARC code list of languages was well beyond our needs.

Would I do the revision again? Yes, certainly. The results make our collections documenting world Lutheranism just a little bit easier to use. I would urge anyone who is considering joining ATLA's efforts to document world Christianity to find a small part of the classification schedule that could benefit from change, and use his or her knowledge of theology and literature in the world context to attempt a revision of the LC schedule.

The *Formula of Concord* would then have been BX8070.5–6, with other catechisms following. The concession to literary warrant in this one case seemed appropriate.

She said the new edition includes these three subclasses as well as the updated versions of KBR and KBU. Now, at last, all of these KB subclasses are valid for use in Class Web.
