TCB SURVEY 2004 RESULTS

Many thanks to all who responded to the *TCB* survey posted on-line and printed in the last issue of *TCB*. All suggestions for improvement will be taken under consideration by ATLA staff, the *TCB* contributors, and the TSS Steering Committee. A couple of the suggestions have been incorporated into this very issue; the remaining suggestions will take a little longer to evaluate and possibly implement. Please continue to keep us informed of your ideas for making *TCB* more useful to you. All feedback is genuinely appreciated.

Eighteen people responded to the survey. The responses are presented below following the survey questions. The numbers will not always add up to eighteen because in most cases, some of the questions on the survey were answered while others were not. And for some questions, more than one answer was appropriate.

1) Which version of *TCB* do you use: a) HTML? b) PDF? c) PRINT?

RESPONSES: a) 5 b) 3 c) 13

2) If you use more than one version, which one do you use the most?

RESPONSES: a) 1 b) 2 c) 1

COMMENTS: "PDF because of its searching capability, but I read it first in HTML. Then, I usually am searching for something I remember reading, so use PDF."

3) How do you use *TCB*: a) Review upon receipt only? b) Refer to at various times as needed? c) Distribute among your staff? d) Put it in a notebook? e) Retrieve articles listed in the bibliography through ILL? f) Some other way? (Please specify)

RESPONSES: a) 4 b) 11 c) 3 d) 6 e) 6 f) 1

COMMENTS:

"Subject Heading and Classification Number Additions and Changes is the part of *TCB* that we use the most. We have a student compare to our database and then change subject headings as needed."

"When there is a significant classification change (e.g., Nov 2003 BM), I copy it and insert in the appropriate printed LC schedule."

"I really like the bibliography of articles!"

"What is in TCB, I can usually find via LC Weekly lists or by Cataloger's Desktop."

4) How could *TCB* be improved as a reference tool in regard to navigation, structure, etc.?

RESPONSES: Five people said in various ways that it was "fine." Two said it was "easy."

SUGGESTIONS:

"Could there be something more blatant than the asterisk to indicate the changed element. Could the change be highlighted with a gray-fill box?"

"...unless we could get the Class changes and LCSH's collated annually."

"It would be nice to have keyword searching for all the online issues simultaneously..."

"Perhaps if it had a "hot" index, one could check the index and link to the topic discussed, reviewed, or reported on."

5) What issues or topics would you like to see addressed?

RESPONSES:

"Perhaps metadata & theological library cataloging."

"As a new cataloger, even more how to's, articles or essays on cataloging religious works."

"notify cataloguers about any rule changes; notify readers of relevant workshops for those working in technical services; notify serials staff about relevant title changes, rule changes..."

"Major changes in OCLC as relating to theological catalogers, such as when the \$v was introduced, a reminder to use \$v for Commentaries sub-headings."

"Maybe more news about what people are doing—do our members do presentations, etc at other library conferences—stuff like that."

"I would be interested to learn about Dublin Core..."

"Trends in cataloging; discussions on cataloging workflow; incorporating things from ATLA conference discussions."

6) Can you think of another added feature that you would benefit from? (Current features being the Subject Heading and Classification Number Additions and Changes, and the News and Views)

RESPONSES:

"Workshops & Conferences; LC Rule Changes; Serials Title Changes"

"The greatest value to me has been to be able to look over any subject heading or classification changes relating to theology. Articles in the past have been helpful as well."

"A permanent feature helpful to us would be a "summary of recent rule changes" and where to go to find out more information if we need to."

7) Would you be willing to contribute to the content of *TCB* by a) writing on a particular topic? b) Scouting for relevant news and trends? c) Providing a review of an article or piece of software, etc.? If so, please indicate your areas of interest and experience.

RESPONSES: Four people said yes, they would be willing to contribute. And four people said no.

8) If you are a theological technical services librarian, and do not find *TCB* useful in your work, how would you recommend that *TCB* be changed to address your specific needs?

RESPONSES:

"I must say that I DO find the notification regarding subject heading changes very helpful. Working in a small setting with no cataloguing colleagues, it is easy to miss out on any changes in the cataloguing world. Any information that can help me stay current is greatly appreciated."

"I find *TCB* useful. But I wonder if it might be possible to post significant changes to the ATLANTIS list? I know it's difficult to decide what's important, because significance varies from library to library, but the Nov 2003 issue listed the change from "Sociology, Christian" to "Christian sociology"—probably a heading change that affects most of us to some degree...."

"YES! Very useful, esp. for Theological class changes and LCSH."
