Other decisions:

September 11 Terrorist Attacks, 2001--Religious aspects

This proposal is appropriate and necessary because individual terrorist attacks are not included in the scope of the pattern list for individual wars. Instruction sheet H 1200 of the Subject Cataloging Manual will be updated to clarify this situation. If individual subdivisions are needed under headings for individual terrorist attacks, the subdivisions should be established.

BIBLICAL CRITICISM MEETS LCSH

The Bible gets "criticized" a lot, in various ways, for various purposes. For catalogers who are not also professors of theology or religious studies, a basic understanding of the differences between the types of criticism applied to works about the Bible is necessary for choosing the correct headings and subheadings to use to provide the most helpful subject access to the material. A scan through the subdivisions listed under Sacred Works (H1188) in LC's Subject Cataloging Manual (SCM), lists these:

- -- Canonical criticism
- -- Criticism, Form
- --Criticism, interpretation, etc. [May Subd Geog]
- -- Criticism, Narrative
- -- Criticism, Redaction
- --Criticism, Textual
- --Feminist criticism [MSG]
- --Reader-response criticism
- --Social scientific criticism [MSG]
- --Socio-rhetorical criticism [MSG]
- --Structuralist criticism [MSG]

Many other types of criticism exist, each having its own benefits and drawbacks. For more information than you might possibly desire to have, you can refer to the *Handbook of Biblical Criticism* by Richard N. Soulen and R. Kendall Soulen (3rd ed., rev. and expanded). Those types of criticism that aren't specifically listed in the Library of Congress subject heading list have to be put in some type of existing semi-appropriate spot, usually under \$xCriticism, interpretation, etc. (one fairly massive repository). Other types of critical material may be put under the subdivision \$vCommentaries (which is a *form* heading for critical material arranged in verse-by-verse format rather than by topic).

Usually, wording found on the title page or in the preliminary matter will specifically mention the type of criticism employed so that you won't have to guess based on what you can surmise from the text. But, lacking glaring clues, you may need to know a little more about how to determine what you're dealing with. Ask yourself, "What is the goal of this critical work?" Is it to reconstruct the wording of the original text? To speak to a particular audience? To discover the origins and history of the text? To determine the authenticity of the text? To discover what the text meant to the people of its time?

Hence, this attempt to describe selected types of biblical criticism for those who are new to theological cataloging, or those who are not *primarily* theological catalogers, or those who might simply want to know a little more about a particular topic. Not to worry, this won't be done all in one fell swoop. For now, consider "form criticism" (from the German Formgeschichte, meaning "form history"). Whole books have been written to define and evaluate form criticism (such as Edgar V. McKnight's What is Form Criticism?), so don't expect this brief description to be anywhere near comprehensive! According to F.F. Bruce, form criticism "endeavors to get behind the written Gospels and their literary sources to the oral stage of the Gospel tradition, and to classify and examine the various 'forms' or types of story, utterance, etc. represented in that oral tradition." ¹ Form criticism is not limited to the Gospels, but is primarily used with them. Examples of literary forms (genres) that have been identified include myths, legends, miracle stories, sayings, parables, and narratives. Of what use is form criticism? H. McKeating does a good job of answering this question for the layperson in The Westminster Dictionary of Christian Theology. He points out that the study of forms may help us 1) determine how the communication might have been received and interpreted by the listener or reader; 2) learn about the social settings (Sitz im Leben) in which they were used; and 3) theoretically, date a particular tradition. This is all the more difficult, as you can imagine, when you're dealing with other cultures, languages, and periods of time. Another purpose of form criticism when it was originally conceived, according to McKeating (and others), was as a means of discovering the origins and development of the various forms.

One bibliographic example using this subdivision is Gerd Theissen's *The miracle stories* of the early Christian tradition, translated by Francis McDonagh, edited by John Riches (ISBN: 0800607007). In this work, the table of contents and preface use wording that make it clear that this is a form-critical work. It has these two subject headings:

650 #0 Miracles. 630 00 Bible.\$pN.T.\$pGospels\$xCriticism, Form.
